We will distribute this prior to the next meeting for discussion at the next meeting. As well, a number of areas of need for position statements have been brought to my attention. Ideally, at the next meeting I would like to discuss with interested parties the following:

- o Epinephrine in the prehospital environment
- o Guidelines for the use of epinephrine in children under 15 kg

It was nice to see members of the Pediatric section at the AAAAI meeting in San Antonio in February. The amount of work necessary to get this approved by the various committees and review panels of the Canadian Paediatric Society (CPS) has been considerable and much more than anticipated. We hope to have the Board of directors of the CPS review the document in the next few months, which would be the last step before completion. Our collaboration with the CPS on this initiative will ultimately strengthen our long term partnership with them. Once completed, we welcome suggestions for optimal dissemination of the guidelines to all pediatric care providers.

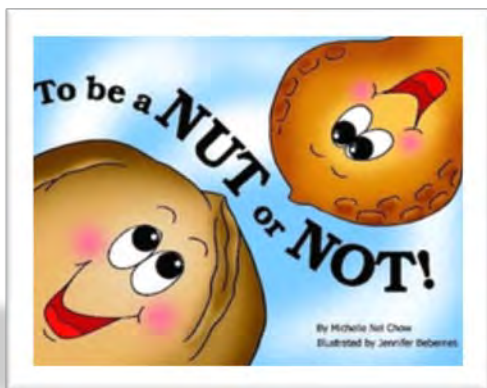
